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1. The Power of television

- Its capability to inform, educate and influence the public
- Its position inside home, its inherent ability to store and retrieve art forms and experiences of all kinds,
- Cultural and artistic impact, The realism of the television image-"Seeing is believing", Dramatic impact in factual news, Manipulation of television image

2. The Program / The show

Meaning and definition of Television Program

- Program overview: Studio production, On location production; live / enacted recording, live transmission / pre-recorded for transmission later, Single camera and Multi-camera set-up,
- Program briefs: Objectives, Contents, and Duration etc.
- Planning: The Story, Subject Research, Scouting location, the treatment, preparing a budget, writing pre-production script, Storyboard, Script layout, Plan of Shooting
- Shooting Equipment: Types of camera: ENG, EFP and Studio Broadcast camera

3. Shooting Style

How to interpret a scene?

• **Best view point**, emphasis on desired features of the scene, drawing audience's attention towards them.

- **Size of the image:** showing various aspects of the story through different image size.
- Focus: Deep focus, Shallow focus and its effects
- Camera angle: Emotional impact of extreme view points; Canted angle
- Camera movement: Adds visual interest, Creates depth and solidity
- Subject vs. Camera moves
- Composition: Simple composition, Persuasive composition, What if you don't compose?

4. Lighting Instrument and Technique

- Lighting Instruments: Spot light, Open face light, V-light, Flood light, LED soft, Diffusion tent on spot lights, Camera light, Grid light and mounting devices
- Light quality: Directional and Diffused light, color quality of light (color temperature), Matching color temperature, White balance
- Position of light and terminology used: Key light, Fill light, Back light, Background light; Sidelight and Kicker, Flat lighting, dimensional lighting,
- Lighting contrast: Subject contrast, frame contrast, Fast fall-off, Cameo lighting, Silhouette and Chroma key area lighting

- Sound and the Microphone, types of microphone, Dynamic, Condenser and Ribbon microphones, Importance of audio in Television production,
